Why DCRP-ISM? Why a catalog?

- Facilitate search
- To increase understanding and making informal transportation more visible
- To model best approaches
- For consistency and comparability
- To Enhance research validity for climate solutions
- To facilitate global insights for global sustainability, road safety and climate goals
- To encourage knowledge sharing and collaboration
- To understand policy and decision-making impact





To develop DCRP-ISM, we need to:

- Identify stakeholders to jointly define the shared purpose and scope
- Identify a stewarding Institution or mechanism
- Form a working group and collaboratively prepare a draft
 - (Based on a diagnosis of existing data collection methods)
- Consult and iterate
- Build consensus and agreement
- Finalize v.1 and roll out pilot
- Disseminate (build capacity)
- Periodic Review and Updates
